### Timing may not be quite right for Henshaw, BYU

So, who is this George Henshaw and why is he interviewing for LaVell Edwards' job?

Well, first of all, friends not only point out Henshaw's credentials are outstanding, but he's got local ties like a knot.

In fact, if you looked at his coaching career, he's more qualified than anybody on BYU's list.

BYU vice president Fred Skousen and athletic director Val Hale interviewed Henshaw last

Henshaw, 52, is the assistant head coach of the NFL's Ten-

nessee Titans.

He's been to four Super Bowls. He's been the head coach at Tulsa, and coached at West Virginia, Florida State, Alabama, the Denver Broncos and New York Giants.

George's brother Vern was just appointed the superintendent of Alpine School District and got his doctorate at BYU after playing football for the Cougars in the 1970s.

His sister Jane Friel lives in Pleasant Grove. A graduate of BYU, she's the principal of Greenwood Elementary School in American Fork.

His other sister, Patty Witt, of Richmond, Va., had a degree from BYU. Another sister, Edna, teach-

es in Sandy.

The Henshaw family grew up in Midlothian, Va., where most of the kids went through grades 1 through 12 in the same building.

George played football at West Virginia for Bobby Bowden, who later hired him as an assistant at Florida State.

George has a son named Matt, who is a 6-foot-4 high school quarterback. Matt's considered one of the top recruits in the Mid-South, and is apparently headed for Clemson.

Henshaw, an active Mormon and son of an LDS patriarch, would appear to be a perfect BYU coaching candidate.

But like Tom Holmoe and Andy Reid, the BYU job comes at an

awkward time.

Henshaw has one more year on his Titan contract. He's got three more years to earn a hefty NFL pension. And his roots and immediate family life is centered in the Virginia area.

What Henshaw represents for BYU officials, is a target interview to fill out and legitimize the

candidate search.

Nothing wrong with that. Henshaw does give BYU's search committee members a candidate they can interview, and report to the president and board of trustees to show they've done their homework with available talent.

And they have.

This is a tough job search. Skousen and Hale have done a credible job doing the homework.

Posting Henshaw's name on the board certainly enhanced the stock of candidates - even if it appears to be an exercise.

"This doesn't come at a good time for George," said one of his

friends.

"It would be difficult for him to leave the NFL even though the idea of coaching in college again would interest him."
