T-Ball Rules:

- Each batter will be allowed 3 swings, one of which must result in a playable ball.
- If a playable ball does not result from one of these swings, the batter will receive a walk and take their place at 1st base.
- A playable ball is a batted ball that is hit by the bat into and stays in fair play territory.
- Runners cannot leave base until ball is hit by batter.
- If someone is tagged out on base, they can stay on base.
- We do not keep score. Everyone who plays wins.
- Every member of the team bats in rotation each inning.
- All team members play defense each inning. One child needs to be placed at each infield position, including catcher and pitcher. The rest of the players need to be spread out in the outfield area. Positions can be rotated each inning.
- A game will consist of 4 innings or 50 minutes, whichever is first.

The armorial bearings for a family Fletcher is: Sable, a cross engrailed, argent, between four plates, each charged with an arrow of the field.

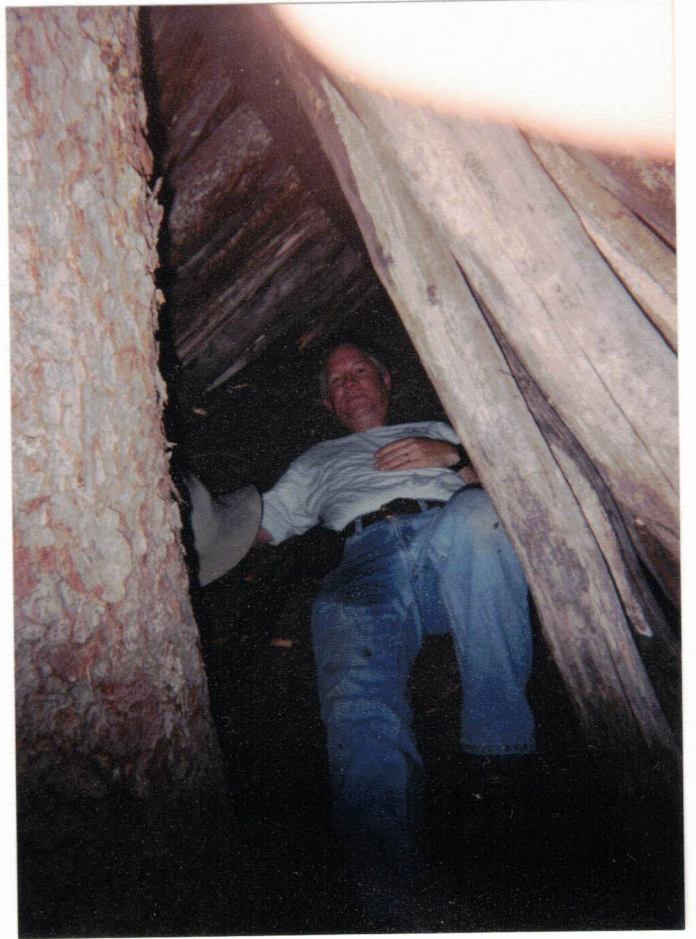

Utah Music Educators Association



Dr. Terry S. Hill is assistant professor of music and orchestra conductor at Utah Valley State College, and until recently, assistant conductor and recording director of the Mormon Symphony and the Mormon Youth Chorus. He is musical director and conductor of the Utah Valley Youth Symphonies and Civic Orchestra. Terry is a native of Provo, and a student of Lawrence Sardoní and the John G. Hilgendorf. At age fourteen, Dr. Hill joined the Utah Valley Symphony and Youth Symphony and the Utah Valley Opera Association Orchestras. He also is pleased to say that he performed twice as principal violist in the Utah All-State Orchestra, being unable to attend a third year due to a football injury. Professor Hill is a popular guest conductor and clinician throughout the Western States. He has twice been orchestra vice president of the Utah Music Educators Association. Hill earned his bachelor and master degrees in music education from Brigham Young University, where he was honored as the outstanding music education major and elected to Pi Kappa Lambda. He received his doctorate from the University of Arizona, Tucson, majoring in instrumental conducting while filling a teaching assistantship with the university orchestra and opera workshop. Dr. Hill has served as assistant conductor of the Salt Lake Chamber Orchestra, as adjunct faculty at Weber State, and as conductor of the National Youth Symphony Workshop at Snowbird for four years. In addition, Mr. Hill taught in the public schools for twenty-five years at both the secondary and elementary levels, specializing in string instruction, general music, and orchestral conducting. He has also conducted orchestras and taught at BYU, Snow College, Rick's College, Southern Utah University, and the University of Utah. As conductor of the Utah Valley Youth Symphonies, Terry lead the group in growth from one small orchestra to seven groups, with which he traveled to London, Hawaii, Spain, Portugal, Austria, and Switzerland. Dr. Hill's talents have also afforded him conducting opportunities in the Hollywood Bowl, Carnegie Hall, Abravanel Hall, Czechoslovakia, and Hungary.

Simon Carrington, director of Choral Activities at the University of Kansas (KU), is a graduate of Cambridge University, England, where he sang in King's College Chapel Choir directed by Sir David Willcocks. He came to KU in 1994 after twenty-five years with one of the world's leading vocal ensembles, The King's Singers, which he founded and co-directed. He sang about 3000 concerts in many of the world's most prestigious concert halls, made over 70 recordings, appeared on countless television and radio programs, and led workshops and master classes in Europe, the United States, Australia, and Japan. Over the past five years Carrington has developed the Choral Ensemble Experience at KU into a diversified and comprehensive program, ranging from traditional to experimental, classical to jazz, and intimate to grandiose. He has established seven choirs, each of which has its own identity. The choirs combine for special events such as the annual Holiday Vespers, now broadcast across the United States, and the Joy of Singing concert series developed by Carrington, which bring together the finest choral ensembles from the region. Every spring the choirs also join with the KU Symphony Orchestra for large-scale choral masterpieces. Carrington directs three of the KU choirs himself, guides his graduate students in the preparation of the other four, and assists with the two vocal ensembles. Professor Carrington directs the masters and doctoral degree programs in choral conducting at KU and travels throughout Europe and the US giving master classes and workshops.



Robert Ponto is associate professor of music and Director of Bands at the University of Oregon. He conducts the Oregon Wind Ensemble and supervises the graduate program in wind conducting. Originally from Milwaukee, Wisconsin, he received degrees from the University of Michigan and the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. Prior to his appointment at the University of Oregon in 1992, Ponto held conducting/teaching posts at the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, East Carolina University, Pacific Lutheran University, and in the public schools of West St. Paul/Mendota Heights, Minnesota. Ponto's frequent appearances as guest conductor include the Detroit Chamber Winds and numerous state and regional honors throughout the United States. His ensembles have appeared at state, regional, and national MENC conferences. In 1991 he conducted a highly-praised performance of excerpts from Conrad Cummings' new opera about Vietnam at the prestigious Bang on a Can contemporary music festival in New York City. Performances conducted by Ponto have been broadcast on National Public Radio's *Music Today* series and recorded on the Opus One record label. As a *from Light* at La Scala in Milan, Italy, as well as many appearances with Tacoma's Washington Brass Quintet. Ponto is an active member of the Music Educators National Conference and the College Band Directors National Association.

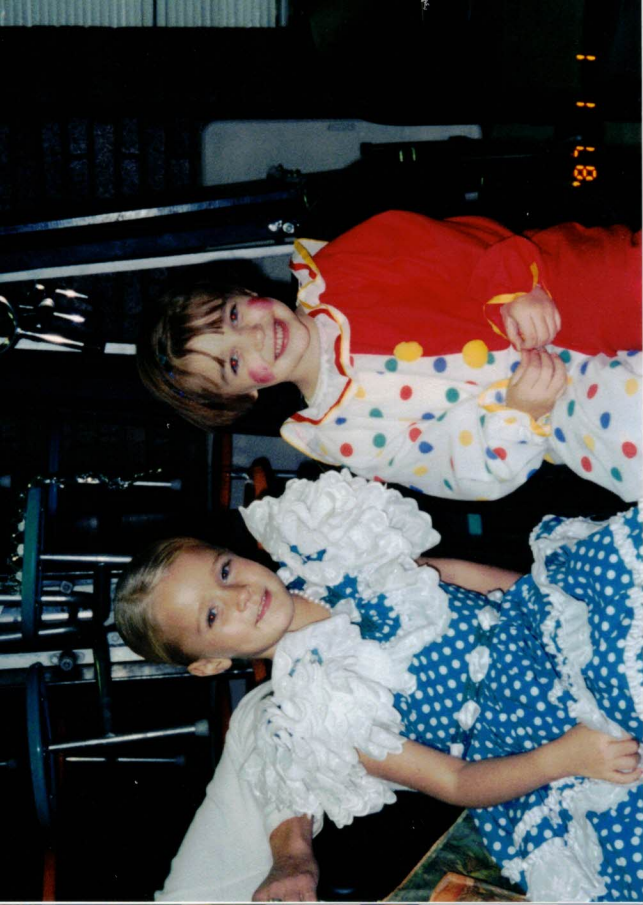

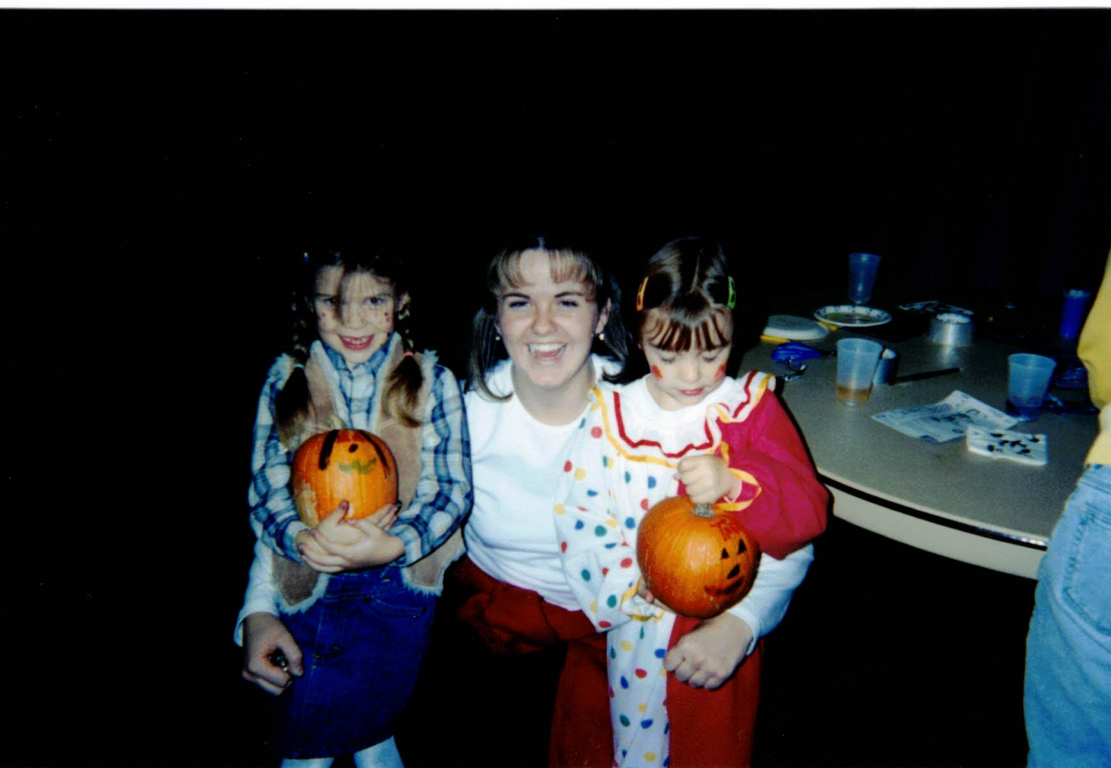

Timing may not be quite right for Henshaw, BYU

So, who is this George Henshaw and why is he interviewing for LaVell Edwards' job?

Well, first of all, friends not only point out Henshaw's credentials are outstanding, but he's got local ties like a knot.

In fact, if you looked at his coaching career, he's more qualified than anybody on BYU's list.

BYU vice president Fred Skousen and athletic director Val Hale interviewed Henshaw last Saturday.

Henshaw, 52, is the assistant head coach of the NFL's Tennessee Titans.

He's been to four Super Bowls. He's been the head coach at Tulsa, and coached at West Virginia, Florida State, Alabama, the Denver Broncos and New York Giants.

George's brother Vern was just appointed the superintendent of Alpine School District and got his doctorate at BYU after playing football for the Cougars in the 1970s.

His sister Jane Friel lives in Pleasant Grove. A graduate of BYU, she's the principal of Greenwood Elementary School in American Fork.

His other sister, Patty Witt, of Richmond, Va., had a degree from BYU. Another sister, Edna, teaches in Sandy.

The Henshaw family grew up in Midlothian, Va., where most of the kids went through grades 1 through 12 in the same building.

George played football at West Virginia for Bobby Bowden, who later hired him as an assistant at Florida State.

George has a son named Matt, who is a 6-foot-4 high school quarterback. Matt's considered one of the top recruits in the Mid-South, and is apparently headed for Clemson.

Henshaw, an active Mormon and son of an LDS patriarch, would appear to be a perfect BYU coaching candidate.

But like Tom Holmoe and Andy Reid, the BYU job comes at an awkward time.

Henshaw has one more year on his Titan contract. He's got three more years to earn a hefty NFL pension. And his roots and immediate family life is centered in the Virginia area.

What Henshaw represents for BYU officials, is a target interview to fill out and legitimize the candidate search.

Nothing wrong with that.

Henshaw does give BYU's search committee members a candidate they can interview, and report to the president and board of trustees to show they've done their homework with available talent.

And they have.

This is a tough job search.

Skousen and Hale have done a credible job doing the homework.

Posting Henshaw's name on the board certainly enhanced the stock of candidates — even if it appears to be an exercise.

"This doesn't come at a good time for George," said one of his friends.

"It would be difficult for him to leave the NFL even though the idea of coaching in college again would interest him."

Chicago Bears offensive coordinator Gary Crowton remains the odds-on-favorite to get the job.

Crowton's been shackled in the Bears offense by having to play quarterback Cade McNown, a top draft pick, pushed on him by the team's management.

Once McNown sat last week, Chicago used Jim Miller to defeat Indianapolis to go 2-7.

BYU's current staff thinks it's Crowton, if he wants the job.
