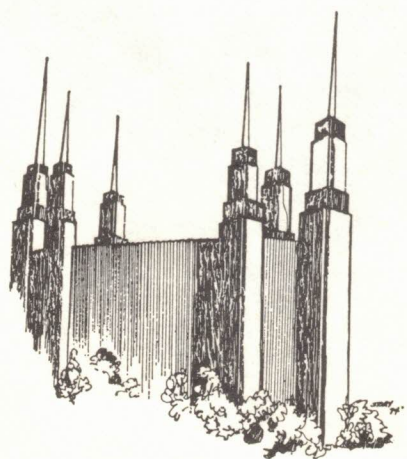

Mirror Lake: It captures an image of peace

Occasionally in mountain country you come on a lake named Mirror, and wonder how it could possibly have been called anything else.

The silver expanse turns pure blue just as the sky does, or drifts images of snowy clouds here and there, or lines its verges with black silhouettes of trees. Pond Lily leaves and flowers form pairs of lovely etchings. If a boat glides over, the twin painting is a work of art.

A mountain peak makes a handsome picture of itself any hour of the day, especially at sunset or sunrise. If the peak is bare of trees, the increasing or declining color may glow on bare shale and rock, its warm glory contrasting with turquoise lake.

Such a lake is the mirror of water located in the high country of the Uintah Basin, between Kamas and Evanston, Wyo. Resting on the back side of Baldy Mountain, at the 10,000-foot level, the clear waters of this Mirror Lake catch and hold the breathtaking images that surround it.

Relatively easy access makes Mirror Lake a popular recreation area for camping, fishing, picture-taking. Snow comes early here, and later on snowmobilers come to marvel at the scenery. But never is the area more beautiful than mid-summer when the colors are strong and bold and the lake is at its reflective best.

It is a scene oft-repeated in our mountain country and one the eye never tires of, as sky and land and water all become one.

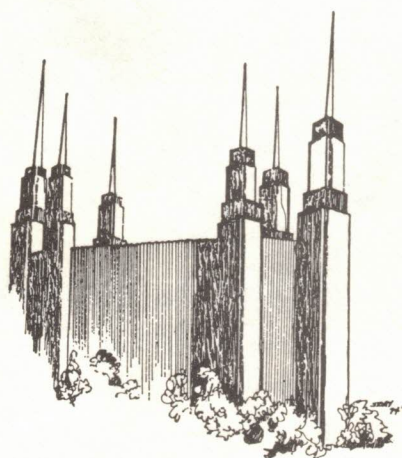

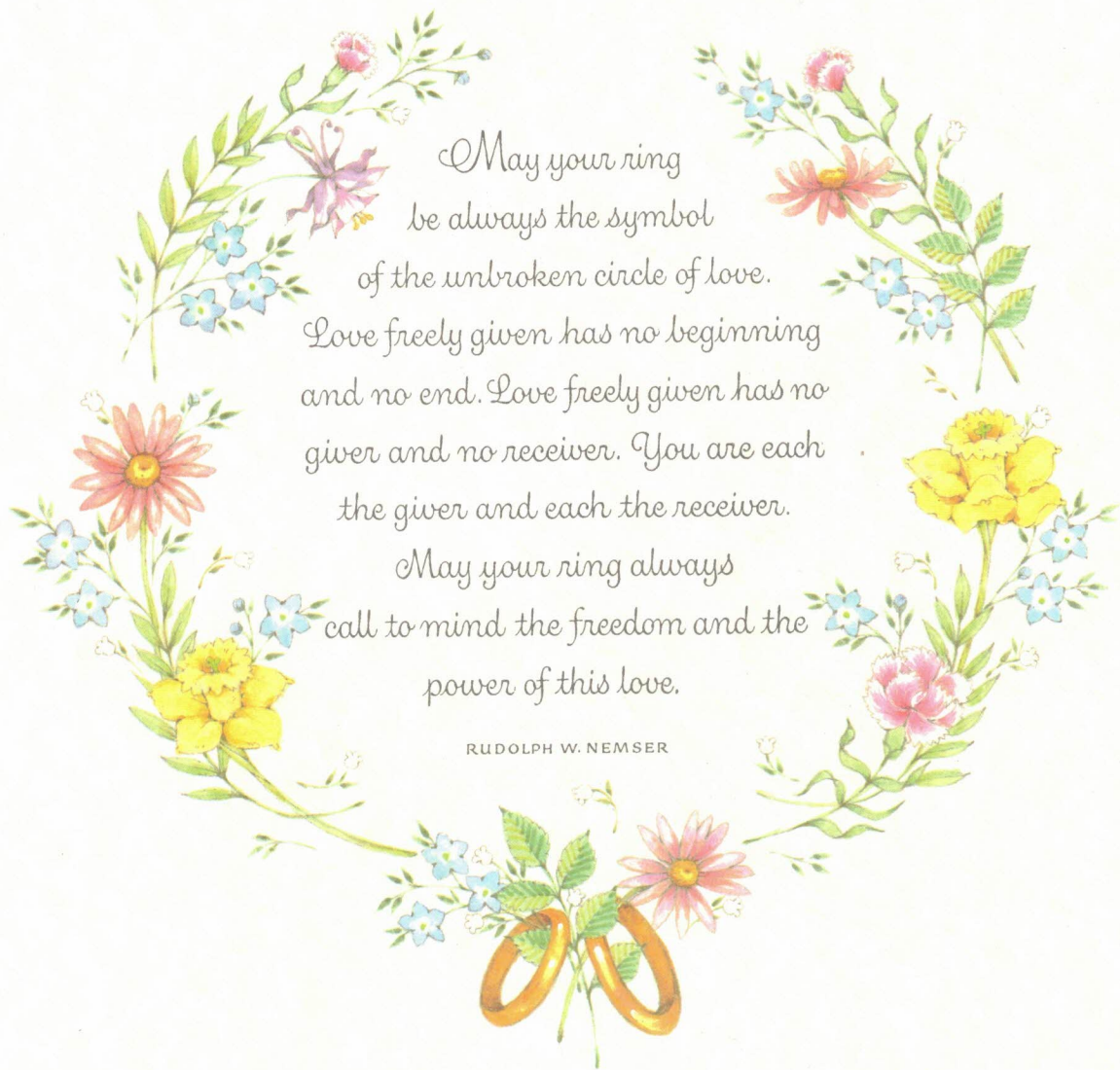

LIMITING GUESTS AT TEMPLE WEDDING CEREMONIES

Those couples planning to be married in the Temples should be counseled that space in the sealing rooms is limited and that they should limit the number of guests invited to witness the ceremony. They should contact the temple in advance to determine the number that can be comfortably accommodated and then limit their invitations accordingly. Only family members and close personal friends should be invited. Temple marriages are sacred occasions and should not be planned as wedding receptions. Where large groups attend, it is difficult to maintain the order and reverence that should exist in the House of the Lord. (Temple Committee)" (ENSIGN December 1975 Page 77)

The following is also stated in the Temple Handbook:

Persons coming to the temple for their own marriage or family sealings should be extended the courtesy of a private sealing in a room where they and their guests will be alone. Combining groups in one sealing room should be done only when requested by all parties concerned.

I want to be kind and gentle and patient so as to listen to your heart's troubles and to understand. I want to be wise and good and serene so that I can help you when things get sort of mixed up.

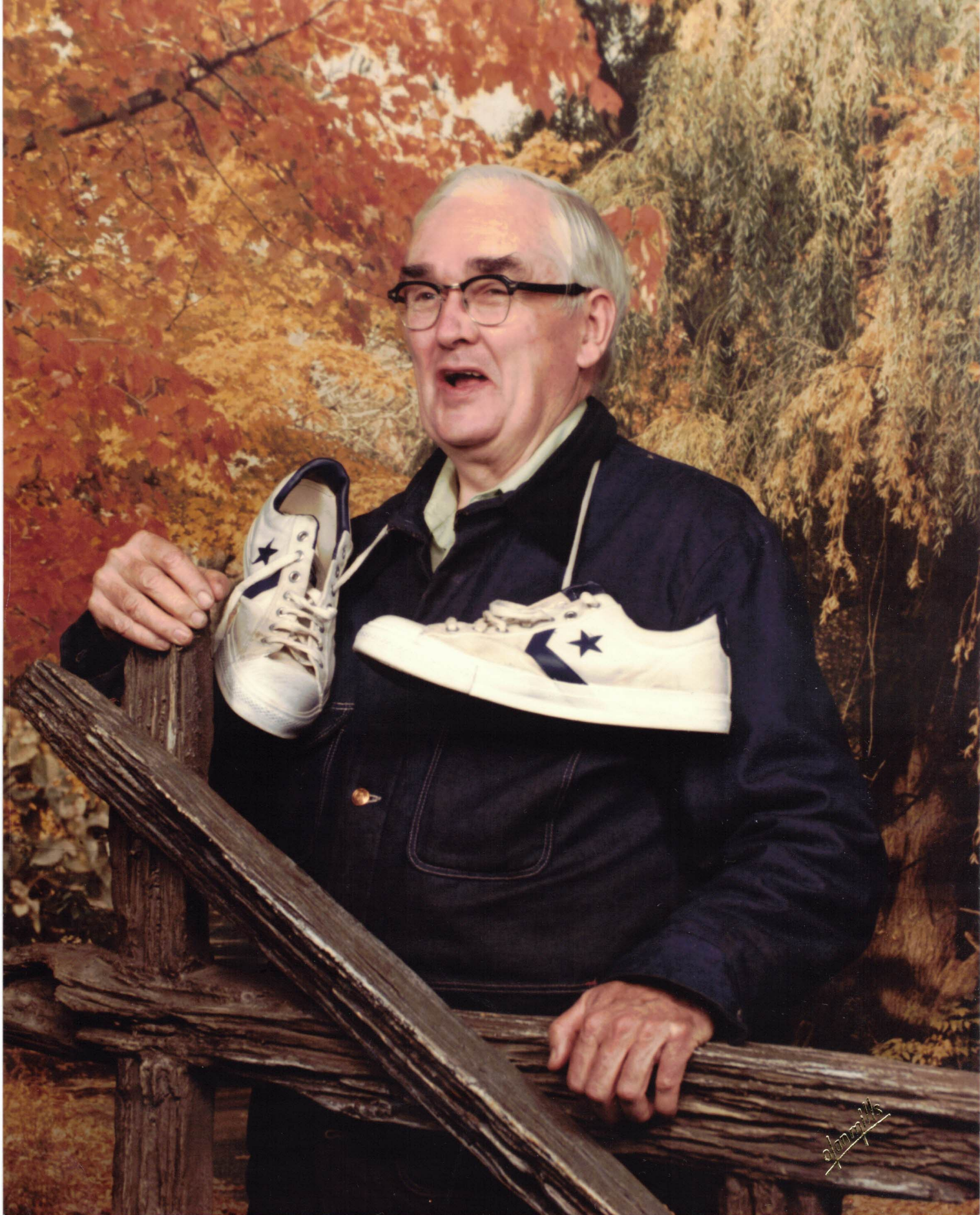

Most of all I want to worship God together and take our children to Sunday School and Sacrament Meeting and always have Christ's presence in our home to bless and guide every phase of our married life.

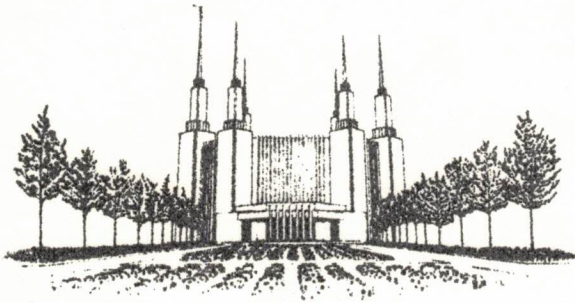

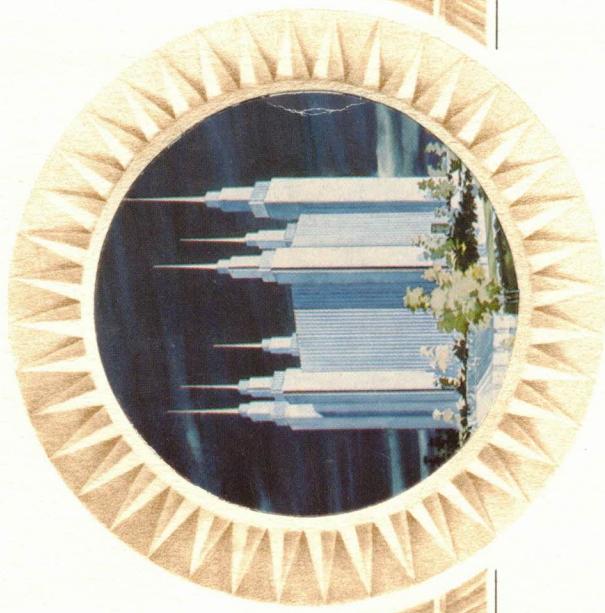
